

# Job Description Youth Counselor 1

**General Objective:** The Youth Counselor 1 is a full time entry level line worker position that provides for the general care of at-risk youth and manages the treatment milieu and routine within a home. The Youth Counselor 1 is the backbone of our quality of care and treatment for these youth.

## **Nature and Scope of this Position**

- Responsible to maintain the daily routine and structure of the home.
- Responsible to work within a treatment team, both within the staff and in the community, in a cooperative and mutually supportive way.
- Forming therapeutic relationships with the youth in care.
- Works under the supervision of the Program Director/Manager and under the clinical supervision of the Lead Clinical Staff.

# Example of Tasks

- Provide a safe, consistent and structured living environment for the youth in care.
  - o Supervision and structure to keep the youth in care safe.
  - o Supervise, manage and instruct positive interaction and conflict resolution among the residents in the home.
  - o Assist with management of a stable yet dynamic set of house rules and values.
  - o Oversee preparation and delivery of regular and nutritious meals.
  - o Provide for transportation or residents.
  - o Oversee and teach chores and general house cleaning/maintenance.
  - o Participate and/or facilitate house group meetings.
  - o Provide guidance.
  - o Help with life planning.
  - o Teach life skills.
  - o Teach and model communication skills.
  - o Assist with relationship building skills.
  - o Teach and model recreation skills and implement the recreational program of the home.
    - Supervise group recreational activities.
    - Provide encouragement to residents to become involved in recreational activities outside of the program.
    - Monitor individual physical programs.
- Work with youth in care to meet their unique and individual needs.
  - o Provide individualized care.
  - o Do informal counseling sessions.
  - o Participate in group therapy sessions.
  - o Insure provision of appropriate outside services, such as mental health, medical, dental, etc.
  - o Advocate for needs of each youth.
- Monitor individual behavior of youth in care.
  - o Provide instruction, praise and reward for positive behavior.
  - o Do intervention with or confrontation of negative or destructive behavior.

- o Give consequences when appropriate.
- o Teach and model appropriate behaviors.
- o Record behavioral data.
- Engage in therapeutic relationships with the youth.
  - o Work as "primary" adult (worker) in a youth's life, including
    - One-on-one time.
    - Involvement in activities with youth.
    - Part of treatment team.
  - o Set appropriate levels of intimacy, shared two-way information and boundaries.
  - o Work with youth's families as partners to YH care and treatment.
- Maintain program structure and assist with program accountability.
  - o Provide input to individual treatment plans.
  - o Make entries in administrative and behavioral logs.
  - o Document all incidents.
  - o Contribute to the update of treatment plans and make regular reports of progress, as required by program, contract and rule.
  - o Stay abreast of all information in logs.
  - o Write reports as necessary and required or requested.
  - o Attend and participate in a wide variety of "treatment team" meetings, such as:
    - Staff Team
    - Staff and therapist teams
    - Mental health treatment teams
    - Child Protection Team
    - Staff and family team
    - Child Study Teams at school
  - o Attend and assist with corporate functions and meetings, as requested.

#### **Responsibilities**

- Provide a safe living environment.
- Operate program as designed and directed.
- Accept supervision.
- Work within a team approach to treatment.
- Have appropriate relationships with youth in care.
- Communicate clearly, precisely and directly.
- Respond to needs of youth in care.
- Provide consistency and structure.
- Give others respect, regardless of opinion, and consideration in dealings with them.
- Be a role model.

# Requirements

- Possess solid moral character.
- Demonstrate competent, positive inter-personal skills.
- Experience working with troubled youth in a paid or volunteer setting.
- B.A./B.S. degree from an accredited college or university or combination of education and experience.
- Knowledge of adolescent development.
- Talents for supervising and working with young people.
- Demonstrated flexibility in approach to solving problems and achieving goals.
- Demonstrated commitment to youth's needs and issues.
- Possess knowledge of:
  - o Parenting skills and techniques.
  - o Child and youth development theory, normalcy and deviance.
  - o Childhood issues, including emotional disturbances, learning disabilities, etc.
  - o Communication skills.
- Ability to lift 50 lbs as needed.
- Ability to climb stairs as needed.
- Willing and able to work a full time schedule that involves either three or four day work weeks that includes shifts that may be as long as 14 hours.

### **Employee Classification, Compensation and Benefits**

- This position is a Full-time, Non-Exempt position.
- Compensation is based on range establish in the Youth Homes Salary Schedule and will be negotiated based on qualifications and experience.
- Youth Homes provides a generous benefit package inclusive of:
  - o Annual Leave, Exceptional Leave, Educational Leave
  - o Health, Dental, Vision, Long-term Disability and Life insurance.
  - o Health Savings Account and 401(k) options with agency match.
